Mixed Knockouts

The Adams Trophy

Better Ball Match Play.

The Trophy was presented by Barbara & Jim Adams in 1972. They are Americans and were members of the club at the time, but soon after they were posted to Nigeria on business. Open to couples living together at the same address. There is no handicap limit. There is no longer a qualifying round for this competition all entrants will go straight into the knockout draw

The Dale Bowls

18 Hole Knock Out Foursomes Match Play Open to any Man/Lady pairing.

Tees: Men – Whites, Ladies – Reds

Ronald Dale, who presented these bowls, was one of the only five Captains who has held office for more than one year and together with our founder Captain, Sir Roland Blades, was only the second to hold office for three years. His Captaincy was for the period 1928 – 1930 and he was also a founder director of the Tyrrells Wood Golf Club. Open to all membership categories. Strokes to be taken from lowest handicap player and in accordance with stroke indices on Men's card, Ladies receive 2 shots due to the SSS difference. Handicap is half the combined handicaps after the adjustments.

The Kingsbury Cup

18 Hole Family Foursomes Knock Out

Open to all members

This Trophy was presented in 1953 by Mr and Mrs Kingsbury specifically as a Family Foursomes Competition.

To support this intent, entry is open to family relations including:

- Husband & Wife
- Parent & Child
- Brother & Sister
- Cousins Aunt/Uncle & Niece/Nephew
- Grandparent & Grandchild

There is no handicap limit shots are taken as ½ the difference between aggregate handicaps of each side. PLEASE NOTE - If there is a lady playing in the four-ball a handicap adjustment is required as there is a difference between the SSS of the White & Red tees. Ladies will receive an additional 2 shots. A single stroke index is to be used – this will be the mens scorecard

Men's Summer Knockouts

The Allam Cup

18 hole Knockout Match Play

The trophy was presented by Ray Allam, who was Club Captain in 1978 and President from 2003 to 2006. Open to 6½ and 5 day members played from the white tees, there is no handicap limit. Matches must be played midweek only.

The Brown Cup

18 Hole Knockout Match Play

The Cup was presented in 1955 by Leslie Brown who was himself, presumably a high handicap player, since this is where his sympathies' obviously lay. Restricted to members with handicaps 13-28 on the day that entry closes. Open to 6.5 and 7 day members. Competitors play off current handicaps during course of the competition

The Frank Moore Cup

18 hole Knock Out Medal Match Play.

Presented by Frank Moore and open to all members. Full Handicap: Yellow Tees, games played midweek only. Format: 18 hole Medal match-play, this is different to a normal match-play competition which would usually be scored as 1UP, 2UP, All square etc. All 18 holes must be completed

The Ken Dobson

Eclectic Competition

All scores from any medal round played between April and October. Open to 7 day members.

2 separate eclectics:

- Gross Eclectic
- Nett Eclectic

When signing up for this competition, members are automatically entered into both the Nett & Gross eclectic. In the event of a tie the following countback method will be used to determine an outright winner. The player who achieved the same lowest score by playing in less rounds will be deemed the winner. This will be used for both the scratch and handicap events.

Nicholls Cup

18 hole Knockout Match Play

This Trophy was presented by George Nicholls, a solicitor in 1955. Handicap Limit: 28 Played off White Tees For members who are aged 55 and over who are 6.5 and 7 day members.

The RJS Pairs

18 hole Knockout Better Ball Match Play

Presented by Bob Sullivan – more details to follow. Open to 7 day members only. Handicap limit: 24 90% difference. White tees

Scottorn Cup

18 hole Knock Out Match Play

Open to all members. Handicap Limit: 12 and under. This Cup was presented in 1955 by Jack Scottorn – Club Captain 1950. Handicap limit reduced to 12 to establish numerical parity between Brown & Scottorn entries. Open to 7 day members

Scratch Knockout Bowl

18 Hole Knockout Match Play, Played off Scratch This Cup was presented in 1976 by Jack Gilmore (Captain 1966 and Vice President 1976-1982). Handicap Limit: 12 or under, competition is played off scratch. Open to 7 day members.

Tyrrells Wood Foursomes

18 Hole Foursomes Knock Out Match Play

The first year of this competition was 1947 but it is not currently known who (if anyone) presented the Trophy. Handicap Limit: 20 – Higher handicappers may enter but must play off 20. Open to 7 day members. Winners are traditionally regarded as Club Qualifiers for the “Daily Mail” Foursomes

The Geoff Hubbard Cup

18 Hole Greensomes Knockout Match Play

This is the first year the Geoff Hubbard Cup will be played for in memory of our past Captain, Board Director and Warren League guru who sadly passed away in October 2017. Geoff had been a member since 1988. This competition is open to all male 7 day members with a competition status handicap of 28 or under
